




#### To help our Volunteer Webmaster we have set the following policies:

#### RESCUE REPORT DECEMBER 2024

Seasons Greetings to everyone. I hope you all have a wonderful holiday season.

First, the calendars. Thank you everyone who ordered them. As you are aware we are on hold until the postal strike is over. We have them ready to go and will mail them as soon as the strike ends. We still have a few left if you would like to order one. We need to sell 19 more to reach our goal for this year.

Rescue has been busy this year.

- We had a young dog come in who only needed foster for a week then was ready to go into his forever home. Now known as Remi he is busy learning agility and rally.
- Then we had the opposite end of the age with a 14 year old male coming into us. Rocky is a really sweet old gentleman. He needed some dental work done but other than that he is a pretty healthy guy. It took a little bit to find the perfect home for him but he will now live out his twilight years in a loving home. He also as another senior dog (pom) to keep him company.
- We than had an emergency call to take 2 males. Like many other "emergency" rescues it became an on again off again situation. The day the foster was to pick them up we found out from a specialist the older dog was in liver failure and the sad choice at the advise of the vet had to be made. Then because of losing his wife, and old dog, the owner decided to keep the younger one hoping to be able to care for him. We are on standby if needed.
- Next I was contacted about 2 princesses who's owner had passed away and needed rescue. So again, got the wheels turning, found a foster. The foster made arrangements to travel the 6 hours and pick up the dogs. That day a call, a groomer friend would take the dogs and keep them. Ten days later, a message, can you please pick up the dogs. So our foster jumped into action, made the trip and the 2 girls are being cared for until ready for adoption. They are 11 years old and one needs dental work which will not be done until end of December. So mid January these 2 girls will be ready for forever home. Foster mom is going to determine if they can be separated or must got together.
- We are in the middle of a rather complicated rescue right now. We are trying to get 9 dogs. The owner who has health issues agreed to surrender them but is now not returning any calls. We know these dogs are in rough shape and will definitely need vet care. They range in age from 1 year to into the teens. It is a touchy situation, and we are moving with caution. We have fosters on standby and the 2 club members trying to get the dogs are doing what they can. Again, it is a complicated situation and we will do what we can to help these dogs. We do know if they come into rescue it will be a very costly undertaking.

Because I am co-chairing the 2025 National Specialty with Olga Gagne, rescue will have a presence at the event. We are looking for donations to put on an auction table. Or donations so we can put together a basket to sell tickets for.

Thank you to everyone who has supported rescue this year. Many of our intakes are older and dental is always required. This can run us from \$1200 - \$2000 per dog. And our funds need to be replenished all the time. We are hoping that we will raise a lot at the National.

## Lifetime Hehievement

Presented to

Richard and Nancy Lopaschuk



The journey became a team effort for Dick, as it was his wife Nancy who really had the fondness for dogs. His first dog as a boy, in Vernon, was a Border Collie and then a Lab, as a teenager, to hunt. It all started over 59 years ago shortly after Dick and Nancy were married. Dick worked for Transport Canada and was a weatherman. Dick met Nancy, who was working as waitress, while going to college in December of 1964. They were engaged in March '65 and married July 1965. They moved to Vancouver where Dick took on a new career with Environment Canada, Water Survey, doing watershed studies. Six months later, they moved to Prince George. Nancy needed a dog, so they decided on getting a purebred German Shepherd Dog, a female puppy. A few years later They had the opportunity to buy a well bred stud dog for \$100. They joined the Northern Interior Kennel Club in Prince George. The spring of 1967 saw the club holding a Sanction Match. Dick walked into the ring for the first time and went BIS. They were hooked and so the real journey into a lifelong dedication began in earnest.

NIKC had applied for their first Championship show in July,1969. Dick was the first Show Chair, because he had a lot of experience in showing and rules (at least 2 years, ha, ha) and Nancy was the Club Treasurer at the time. Thus, the show experience started to take shape and would extend over the next 50+ years chairing shows for three different clubs. Nancy and Dick acquired a Miniature Schnauzer and a Pointer while in PG and bred several litters of Schnauzers while Dick was training the Pointer for hunting. He was also training a GSD in Obedience and tracking. Dick was a ski patroller and had trained two dogs for avalanche rescue with Search and Rescue for the City of Nelson. All this was done while working full time and starting to raise a family.


Dick was transferred to Nelson in January 1973. Upon arriving in Nelson and finding no opportunities for training they decided to see if there was interest in the West Kootenay to form a Club. In Sept. "73 the West Kootenay Kennel Club was formed. Their first Championship show was in 1975 and followed the Cranbrook Shows. Dick was the President, Superintendent, and Show Chair for the first shows and many of the subsequent shows that followed. After stripping Miniature Schnauzers for almost 15 years they decided they needed a different breed of terrier and bought a Cairn. Their daughter was in Juniors and needed a dog so the Cairn fit really well for her. The Cairns did very well in the ring with many Canadian and AKC Champions. They bred and showed Cairns for almost 40 years. One of their Wire Foxes was trained by their Daughter for Obedience. At 10 years old she won high in class for her final leg in CD under judge Evelyn Kenny! Both their son Ryan and daughter Lara were involved in the Junior Handling program during this period. Ryan handled his Wire Fox Terrier and Lara handled her Cairn Terrier.

Dick and Nancy made their final move to Cranbrook in 1984, and Dick became President and Show Chair for the Cranbrook and District Kennel Club. He has held these positions (off and on) for many of the years since then. After 25 years breeding and showing German Shepherd Dogs, 15 years Miniature Schnauzers, 40 years Cairn Terriers and 5 years Wire FoxTerriers we decided we needed a retirement breed and chose the Papillon. 21 years later we are still breeding and exhibiting this wonderful little breed. They have had many Champions with all these breeds throughout the years, mostly owner handled. After handling many club members dogs with great success, Dick decidedto start his judging career in the mid 1980's. His first permit was Terriers in1989, and he completed All Breed Status by 2001-retiring in 2022.

Dick and Nancy have been CKC Members for 58 years. In 1988 Dick ran for the CKC Board for the Interior of BC and Yukon and won the election in CKC's Centennial year. He spent 12 years on the Board retiring in 2002 and then appointed again to the Board for 2 years in 2017 replacing a Board member who sadly passed away. Over the 33 year period, Dick judged in 16 different Countries on 5 continents. In 2022 Dick decided to retire from judging while still at the top of his game.

There have been many memorable shows that he has judged with Nancy travelling by his side. The most memorable was BIS at the 2005 Melbourne Royal with over 4000 entries. He chose the magnificent Dandie Dinmont Terrier for his BIS and a lovely Dalmatian Runner-up. This Dandie came to North America several months later to become one of the top winning dogs in the USA. Another very memorable dog he judged was the Siberian Husky "Niklas" awarding him his first BIS in 2004, leading up to him being number one dog in Canada with 83 BIS's. He will always remember his first and last BIS. The first was a Standard Manchester Terrier, judging at the first club he belonged to, Northern Interior Kennel Club in Prince George. His last show in 2022 was at Elgin County where he awarded BIS to an Irish Setter. He also had the privilege of judging the Black Russian Terrier National Specialty at this show with 28 dogs competing. They gifted him a beautiful case and inside was a bottle of vodka and Kahlua with a recipe for Black Russian cocktails!! Elgin County gave him a wonderful sendoff for his retirement. The last show he Judged was in Great Falls Montana in October and they also surprised him with another wonderful sendoff and lovely gift. Although retired from judging we are still able to see Dick and Nancy competing at the shows. If they aren't showing they are ring stewarding. It is always a pleasure to visit with them both yearly as they oversee the new executive at the Cranbrook and Dist Kennel Club. As the photos show - Dick and Nancy's love for a good time makes Cranbrook one of the must attend shows out West. On behalf of us all, it is our pleasure to award you both with this years Lifetime Achievement Award. Thank you for your immense contribution to our sport of dogs.

### News from the Atlantic region and Quebec.

#### From Newfoundland and Labrador:

<u>From Sandi Collins</u>. I asked Sandi to include this information as I had never heard of Canine Vasculitis and thought it could be educational to all.

On September 23, 2024, I had to say goodbye to my sweet little Lindy Lou at the age of 13. She was diagnosed with Vasculitis on August 29th. In the later part of August, I noticed that Lindy had some crusting on the edges of her ear tips that began to bleed and then fall off leaving gouges out of the edges of her ears. The bleeding was considerable and needed pressure to stop. I got her in to her animal hospital on August 27th. Lindy was also diagnosed with a yeast infection in both ears and was given antibiotic drops. The Veterinarian said that she thought Lindy had vasculitis and took pictures and would reach out to colleagues as she had never seen this before. A few days later, the Veterinarian called and said that extensive testing was needed, x-ray, ultrasound and biopsy of ear under anesthesia, to determine the underlying cause but she didn't think it was necessary at her age because it would not change the treatment. The following day we had a complete blood workup done to determine if her liver functions were good before we started treatments. Her bloodwork was very good for her age and treatment started a week later. Lindy was taking 4 different medications along with a cream for her ears. Her medications included Pentoxifylline, Doxycycline, Prednisone and Vitamin C liquid. Lindy was taking these medications for a couple of weeks when her appetite decreased and she became increasingly agitated with taking the medications, all of which were liquid except for the Prednisone. It was very uncharacteristic of Lindy to protest so strongly so I stopped giving her all the medications in the hope that her appetite would increase, with the exception of the Prednisone which I continued to give her. That was about 5 or 6 days before she passed. She had a return appointment for Monday, September 23 and unfortunately declined very rapidly over the weekend. I knew she was ready to cross over the Rainbow Bridge and did so at our last Veterinarian visit. My sweet Lindy Lou was one in a million and she and I had a very special bond and I miss her with all of my being. Fly free my sweet angel.


## **Better Breeder Code of Ethics**

The Better Breeder Institute's Code of Ethics is written keeping the best interests of our dogs at heart, as well as the families we entrust our puppies to. Conscientious breeders should exceed the minimum requirements and expectations, setting a standard for others to follow. The goal always being to produce quality dogs that closely conform to their breed standard, of sound temperament, are vigorous, and free of health problems. To that end, I hereby pledge and certify:

- 1. To support the preservation and advancement of my breed.
- 2. To plan each breeding with the primary intention to improve my bloodline within the foundation of correct breed type and original breed purpose.
- 3. In every breeding, to analyze the pedigree and conformation of both the sire and dam, with consideration of the breed standard and the principles of genetics.
- 4. To only incorporate dogs free of serious or disqualifying defects. Further, to refrain from using any dog that is found to consistently produce afflicted puppies.
- 5. To perform all health screens on my breeding stock as recommended by my national breed club.
- 6. To maintain high standards of health, maintenance, and care for my dogs. Facilities are to be kept clean and orderly.
- 7. Not to sell any puppy until it is at least eight (8) weeks of age.
- 8. To be judicious in the sales of my puppies and concerned about the type of buyers they are placed with. I will not sell puppies into homes where I question the care, treatment, or safety of the puppy, or to dog wholesalers, retailers, pet shops, or at auction. I will require buyers of pet-quality puppies to spay/neuter them at a safe & appropriate age.
- 9. That all my puppies are seen by a licensed veterinarian and given a full veterinary exam before going to a new home. Any health issues or concerns are to be fully communicated and detailed to the buyer.
- 10. With the sale of every puppy, I will provide the buyer with a properly-executed sales contract, health guarantee, registration papers, and diet, vaccination, and parasite control records at the time of purchase.
- 11. That my advertising, marketing, and communication will be factual and honest, both in substance and implication.
- 12. To be available to my puppy buyers for whatever reasonable advice and assistance they may need through the lifetime of the dog.
- 13. To request that my puppy buyers advise me if they are ever unable to keep their dog so that I can either take the dog back or help assist in placing the dog in a new home.
- 14. To conduct myself equitably, ethically & professionally toward everyone, whether partners, clients, or competitors.

The **Better Breeder Institute's Code of Ethics** is intended as a standard of etiquette and behavior for responsible dog breeders. It is not to be construed as a rule or regulation to be enforced by punishment. Breeders are expected to police themselves in a civil and responsible manner.





Cindy has served Papillon Canada as Newsletter Editor (for 6 years), publishing the 1<sup>st</sup> handbook and the 2<sup>nd</sup> handbook, along with the production of the club pins and is the current Club Secretary.

**Jaclair (Carol Mclaughlin, AB)** I am pleased to be breeding and enjoying papillon under the "Jaclair" name. My mother started this kennel in 1960. I have lived with and loved papillons ever since. In the early 1990's, I decided to reestablish the Jaclair line. After careful research I found Ch Lightoots Allo at Jaclair and Ch Josandre' GG Miss Molly, who both go strongly back to well known Jaclair dogs. They have so far produced several beautiful puppies including Ch Jaclair's Encore, who I hope will be the foundation of the new Jaclair.

Jordannas (Lynne Beilhartz, ON) purchased my first papillon from Rosvaire Kennels in 1996. Since then I have put championships on two homebred littermates. I have been active in dogs since 1980 with conformation and obedience boxers and have added agility with the papillons. An active member of several kennel clubs and the coordinator of our local training.center. I take as many educational courses as I can to upgrade my skills as a competitor and potential conformation judge.

**Kenrennie (Kenworthy, BC)** Betty bred and showed her Kenrennie line until her death in 1996. Sam, her husband and Shirra, her daughter have continued the kennel in memory of Betty. Betty's dogs earned many championships and obedience titles and they continue to do so today. Her line can be found in many Canadian and US pedigrees. Her line's influence will continue for a long time. Betty is greatly missed.

**Kernow (Gillian Hunn, ON)** has been involved with purebred dogs all her life, living with Cairn Terriers and Rhodesian Ridgebacks as a youngster in England. Her first attempt at obedience training was in 1962. After moving to Canada and the US with her husband and family, she returned to Canada and the sport again in 1973, with some success. After putting an OTCh on her Mini Schnauzer and training her rescue Mini Poodle to Utility, Ch & OTCh Jaclair's Tracikin UD Am CDX, came to her throught Diana Pierce in 1977. Traci became the foundation of Kewnow Papillons and finished her Ch and OTCh easly. She was the dam of an OTCh litter, four generation of homebred, owner handled Group Placers, Can & Am Champions, BPIS and BPIG winners.

Kinduhaven (Belle Darris, NS) Belle purchased her first Papillon in 1981 but didn't produce her first litter until 10 years later, the dam being her foundation bitch, Ch Maywoods Bella Pandora. Belle imported Ch Tanarglen Wee Colonial Boy CD (GRB)He was# 5 Papillon in 1988 and her Ch Luxxor's Trustworthy (USA) was# 2 in 1993. Kinduhaven Papillons are active in Conformation, Obedience and Therapy Dog work, living up to the Kennel's slogan "Winning hearts in the home and ribbons in the ring". Belle is currently serving her second stint as President of Papillon Canada and has also served as Regional Director and Newsletter Editor in the past. Belle is also the owner and publisher of Papillon News, a bimonthly newsletter for Papillon Lovers.

**Mantoga (Jo Raymer, AB)** has been active in the ring for a number of years with her Ch Arkeno's the Sting at Mantoga. Sting has placed in the top 5 Papillon standings for the last 4 years, twice gaining the Number 1 spot. Sting also has 2 Best In Shows to her credit. Jo has imported several Ringlands dogs, who have completed their Championships with many Group wins and placements.

**Maplerich (Laurie Cheney, ON)** received their first papillon from Patricia Hritzo of North Starr's fame. North Starr's No Nonsense (Silky) finished her Canadian Championship very easily, winning Best of Breeds from the classes. Now, at the age of 5. she has finished her American Championship. She has two Ch. offspring. Golden Retrievers are our first breed, but we at Maplerich are totally smitten with these wonderful butterfly dogs!" All papillons sold at Maplerich are on a non-breeding contract. Healthy, happy, home raised puppies.

**Maringay (Fowler, Scotland)** Gladys was famous for her Maringay Papillons. These papillons were the foundation of her daughter, Moira Ure's Annacott line. Gladys was one of the pioneers of Papillons in Scotland and her line's influence can be felt in many pedigrees. Gladys passed away in 1996 and she is sadly missed.

**Mercer (Robin Mercer, ON)** I started with this most wonderful breed in 1995 having acquired my first Papillon "Crystal" from Sherrie & Jim Puzak (USA). I was so taken with the breed and wanted to get into showing, so I later acquiared other dogs from Sherri, one of which was our first Canadian Champion Sherjak's Mighty Fancy (Butchie) Over the pst 3 years, my daughter Aimee and I have continued to show my homebred puppies and we have finished 4 champions, with others pointed.

**Minifee** (Edith & Denis Bertrand, QC) My husband and I are proud to show you our kennel Minifee. We gout our first papillon in 1995 and we have bred papillons since 1997. We also have Phalenes, but we aren't breeding them yet. Most of our lines come from Europe. We have 2 Canadian Champions, on is our first Phalene male. All our dogs are raised in the family with love.

**Nymphenberg (Smith, BC)** Harvey was a long time fancier and bred very seldom. He was a founding member of the Papillon Canada and a very active supporter for over 30 years. Sadly Harvey passed away March 7, 2000 and is greatly missed by many.

Rosvaire (Vaire Solandt, ON) is active still. Her dogs have done quite well in conformation, beginning with Ch Oxney Fella #1 Pap, #5 toy in 1972, followed by Ch rosvaire Renoir #2 pap 1975 (sone of Ch Oxney Fella); Ch Cherubs Rebel of Rosvaire #2 Pap 1982; Ch Roavaire Rapid Transit #3 Pap 1983 (Cherub's son); Ch Rosvaire Ring in the New #1 in 1985 and #2 in 1986; Ch Rosvaire Rhythm of the Rain #4 in 1989. She continues to place in the top 5 papillons with her most recent Ch Monteith Rosvaire Busy Signal #2 Pap in 1991 – bred by Shirley Waller. "Polly" has also earned her American Championship and placed many times in the Group in Canada. Rosvaire has never produced a lot of litters, opting instead for producing good puppies.

**Sealoch (Grant & Melissa Fancey, NS)** Grant and Melissa have bred and/or owned 50 Shetland Sheepdog Champions, including 5 Record of Merit and High in Trial and Best in show and Best in Specialty winners since 1978. They obtained their first Papillons in 1997 from Jo Raymer's Mantoga Kennels. Their foundation bitch, Ch Mantoga Sealoch Argentina produced the first Sealoch Papillon litter in 1999. Grant & Melissa participate in conformation and obedience competitions. They are also active in their local volunteer programs, which include a Canine Program at the local Women's Prison and Therapy dog visits to Senior Citizen Homes. Melissa is the Web Master of her recently compiled Papluver's List, a compilation of Papillon owners/breeders around the world.

**Wynfield (Ionson, Ontario)** Rosa Passed away December 11, 1993. Her daughter, Joyce Snider and then her granddaughter Virginia Hansford continued the kennel until the early 1990's. Wynfield's is no longer actively breeding/showing but their legacy lives on in pedigrees of Papillons today. Rosa, a life member of the CKC and Papillon Club of America, is sadly missed.
